

Shinsarugakuki ~cirque de kyoto~

Sarugaku is an ancient form of popular entertainment that featured all the performance elements beloved by the populace of the old capital city of Kyoto, ranging from dance, song, puppet plays, magic tricks, and comic skits to large-scale illusions and death-defying acrobatics. These elements were filtered by the jaded audiences in the capital and chosen by the masses, and in this process, parts were adopted to be ultimately refined and developed into such dramatic performance genres as Kyogen, Noh, Kabuki, and Bunraku. Now, those Sarugaku elements have become components of these traditional performance arts that today are considered preeminent categories of Japanese culture. In other words, the origins of performance art culture lie in spectacles beloved by the masses: Popular performances that both old people and young people enthusiastically enjoyed. That is why I have subtitled this performance "cirque de kyoto," meaning "circus of Kyoto." Coh Takahashi



The new form of performance created through Classic Literature × Traditional Arts × New Technology that we call Shinsarugakuki ~cirque de kyoto~ is finally complete. A work called the Shinsarugakuki ["A New Account of Sarugaku"], written by the court noble Fujiwara Akihira (d. 1066) in the mid-Heian Period, describes the passionate enthusiasm of the populace for these performances, and that enthusiasm is expressed here through the diverse performance arts that were brought to Japan, where they took root and underwent refinement, and by the folk performance arts that were carefully passed down through the centuries in the streets of Kyoto (including the Yasuraiodori). In Kyoto's unique process of cultural creation, scenes from a variety of ethnic groups have been brought together, mingled in dimensions beyond differences of language, mutually heightened, and brought to completion in performances infused with the energy of the popular audience. These will be the very first and very last of the performances, so please take this opportunity to come and enjoy them!
